Northwest Annual Fire Report 2010

The Northwest Interagency Coordination Center (NWCC) is the Geographic Area Coordination Center (GACC) for the Northwest Region which includes the States of Oregon and Washington. NWCC serves as the focal point for interagency resource coordination, logistics support, aviation support and predictive services for all state and federal agencies involved in wildland fire management and suppression in the geographic area.

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GENERAL INFORMATION

The Northwest Interagency Coordination Center (NWCC) is responsible for compiling fire reports for all *large* wildland fires in Oregon and Washington on lands administered by the following five federal agencies; BLM, BIA, USFS, FWS, NPS, and two state agencies; ODF and DNR (for acronyms, see Agency Identifier Legend). A *large* fire is defined as greater than 100 acres in forest fuel type, and greater than 300 acres in shrub and grass fuel types. Annual figures from individual units for total fire starts, regardless of size, and acres burned are also included.


Statistics used in this report were gathered from the Fire and Aviation Management Web Applications (FAMWEB) system, which includes the Situation Report and Incident Status Summary (ICS-209) programs and Kansas City Fire Access Software (KCFAST) reporting applications. Previous NWCC annual reports, National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC) annual reports and other sources were also used in this document. The statistics presented here are intended to provide a geographic area perspective of annual fire activity, but may not reflect official figures for a specific agency. 2010 NORTHWEST FIRE SEASON NARRATIVE

SUMMARY

Wildfire activity in the Northwest in 2010 was considered below average by most measures. There were 151,960 acres reported burned, compared to the 10-year average of 473,686. This followed a trend of mild activity in 2008 and 2009. Limited wildfire activity, along with favorable burning conditions, however, provided for very productive prescribed fire opportunities in the Northwest, with 135,198 acres reported burned.

Despite the limited wildfire activity, NWCC provided continuous interagency coordination, logistics support, aviation support, and media support for wildfire and other incidents in the Northwest and the US. NWCC’s Predictive Services Unit provided continuous support with fire situation reporting and analysis, fire behavior and fuels analysis, GIS support, and ongoing “Significant Fire Potential” forecasts and interpretation of significant meteorological events.

FUELS AND WEATHER

Early 2010 predictions called for an earlier start to fire season but milder-than-usual fire activity for the duration of the season. Though snowpack across the Northwest as of late April was running on average 50-75% of normal, this was eventually offset by heavy precipitation in late spring, keeping fuel moistures high. The greenness of light fuels was described in places as being “a month behind schedule.” The lack of significant fire activity until mid-July bore this out.

LARGE FIRE ACTIVITY

Large fires first occurred in the geographic area in Washington. On July 10th, the Swakane fire (human-caused) started 6 miles north of Wenatchee, burning 19,291 acres. Lightning events affected the same area in late July and early August, burning an additional 2,065 acres in the Wenatchee River Complex.

Beginning in mid-August, Oregon saw multiple large fires, primarily due to lightning. In southwestern Oregon the Oak Flat fire on the Rogue-Siskiyou National Forest actively drew firefighting resources from August 13th until early September. Multiple, lightning-caused fires were started in central Oregon beginning August 17th. The White Lightning Complex consisted of multiple fires on and around the Warm Springs Reservation, and burned 33,701 acres. The Lower Deschutes Complex on Prineville BLM burned 9,304 acres. The View Lake Fire Complex was a long duration event on and around the Mount Hood National Forest, with substantial closures and impacts to recreational lands.



Figure 1. Oregon Large Fires Map 2010



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

Figure 2. Washington Large Fires Map 2010


