Strategic Intent:

1. Determine geographic distribution of ground and aviation resources currently within the GACC.
2. Analyze the additional need for resource support to current large incidents and to meet expected initial attack; especially from forecasted lightning this week.
3. Reallocate any under-utilized resources to shortage areas and pursue acquisition of additional resources through requests to NMAC/NICC.

5	Horseshoe	WA-GPF	B. Gales	Heavy bug-kill component; pursuing direct strategy
6	231	WA-NES	M. Ciraulo	70% containment; no critical needs
7	Paradise	WA-OLP	B. Hahnenberg	Confine/contain strategy; long duration fire.
8	21 Mile Grade	WA-COA	D. Leitch	TOC back to local unit tomorrow
