Strategic Intent:

1. Continue to support initial/extended attack; staff current large fires and develop ready reserve for emerging large fires.
2. Monitor and manage mandatory days off for critical resources, primarily Type 1 crews, in order to sustain Geographic Area capability.

PNW Incident Priorities (*set once per day*):

1	Initial Attack			Initial Attack always first priority.
2	Stouts Creek	OR-ORS	J. Buckman	Considerable open line and active threats to communities.
3	Wolverine	WA-OWF	C. Schulte	Open line, threats to mining concerns, Lucerne, Holden Village.
4	Cable Crossing	OR-ORS	L. Smith	Burnout completed; level 1 evacs remain, close to mop-up phase.

Incident management teams are not yet in place on Phillips Creek and Baldy. These incidents will be included in tomorrow's priority ranking.
