Strategic Intent:

1. Continue to fully utilize all available resources to support initial attack, extended attack, and existing large fires while identifying resources that could be re-allocated to emerging large fires as necessary.

PNW Incident Priorities (*set once per day*):

1	Initial Attack			Initial Attack always first priority.
2	Stouts Creek	OR-ORS	J. Buckman	Level 2 evacuation in place. Active fire behavior on several flanks.
3	Wolverine	WA-OWF	C. Schulte	Continued structure protection. Level 3 evacuation in effect.
4	Phillips Creek	OR-UMF	B. Fillis	Burnout continues. Partial closure of Highway 204.
5	Baldy	WA-COF	B. Gales	Moderate fire activity. Residences and major power lines threatened.
6	Collier Butte	OR-RSF	D. Johnson	Indirect strategy. Reconnaissance and intel gathering today.
7	National Creek Complex	OR-RSF	D. Hutton	Multiple Strategies.
8	Cable Crossing	OR-ORS	L. Smith	Transfer of command back to the local unit scheduled for Sunday August 9th.

Incident management team not yet in place on Hwy 8. This incident will be included in tomorrow's priority ranking.
