Strategic Intent:

1. Continue to fully utilize all available resources while identifying a ready reserve to staff another IMT deployment.
2. Maintain crew capability by managing days off and length of assignment.
3. Realign some IA resources currently supporting large fires in anticipation of increased IA activity.

PNW Incident Priorities (*set once per day*):

<u>Priority</u>	<u>Fire</u>	<u>Unit</u>	<u>IC</u>	<u>Rationale</u>
1	Initial Attack			Initial Attack always first priority.
2	Stouts Creek	OR-ORS	J. Buckman	Level 1 and Level 2 evacuations in effect. Developing burn plan for south flank.
3	National Creek Complex	OR-RSF	D. Hutton	Active fire behavior. Threats to Diamond Lake and Hwy 230 corridor.
4	Wolverine	WA-OWF	C. Schulte	Level 3 evacuations in Holden Village. Increased activity on Goode and Blankenship.
5	Collier Butte	OR-RSF	D. Johnson	Active fire behavior. Prepping for burnout operations.
6	Baldy	WA-COF	B. Gales	North flank line construction continues. Mop up on all other flanks.
7	Phillips Creek	OR-UMF	B. Fillis	Evacuations lifted. Mop up in all divisions. Transfer of command back to the local unit scheduled for August 12th.
8	Highway 8	WA-WFS	R. Allbee	Transfer of command back to the local unit scheduled for August 10th.
