Northwest Activity Summary

Light showers across the geographic area were sporadic for most of the week. Cloud cover was intermittent and lighter through the week, allowing clear skies that helped temperatures climb to slightly above average. Widespread pile burning and some agricultural burning continued through the week. Initial attack was light. On 1/18, PNW Team 3 – R. Johnson mobilized Kelso, WA to assist with COVID-19 Pandemic vaccination response.

Northwest Fire Weather Summary

Lingering light showers are expected today in southwestern, central and eastern Oregon.
