### Northwest Activity Summary

Cooler, slightly moister and breezy conditions continued across the Geographic Area. Scattered precipitation and lightning occurred mainly in southern and eastern Oregon. Initial attack once again was light, but ignition potential continues to increase.

#### Northwest Current Incident Details

#### Incidents not Previously Reported: 1

**7K.** OR-781S-000115. Type 4 IC. 12 Miles southwest of Veneta, OR. Start 5/26. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Human. 321 Acres. 45% containment. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Mop up of main fire to 300 feet, spot fires 100% before transitioning fire back to landowner.

#### Incidents Previously Reported: 2

**Dillon Creek.** OR-FWF-230118. Type 4 IC. 16 miles southeast of Chemult, OR. Start 5/20. **Confine.** Cause: Lightning. 3119 Acres (+0). 85% containment. Timber. Utilize firing operations to take use natural starts to re-introduce fire on to priority landscape. Keep fire effects to a level that mimics natural fire that isn't destructive and meets resource benefit objectives.

**W-470.** OR-WIF-230111. Type 3 IC. 1 Mile northeast of McKenzie Bridge, OR. Start 5/30. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Human. 72 Acres (-78). 1% containment. Reduction in acres due to improved mapping. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Trail and area closures. Continue with direct fireline where feasible and secure containment lines to prevent escape.

## Northwest Fire Weather Summary

Lingering isolated showers and thundershowers will drift out of southeastern Oregon today leaving dry conditions there and elsewhere today and Saturday. Some isolated thundershower may return to southern Oregon on Sunday or Monday and increase next week. Otherwise, a 4 or 5 day warming and drying trend is underway for the region. General winds will be decreasing in central Oregon and central Washington and turning more northerly. General winds will be increasing from the north on the west side.

## Northwest Fire Potential Summary

ERC and BI values will climb through Monday or Tuesday due to the warming and drying trend expected for the region. Some PSAs are anticipated to rise into the yellow significant fire risk category by the weekend and early next week due to the rising fire danger.
