Northwest Activity Summary

Mild and dry yesterday with poor humidity recovery at higher elevations in Southern Oregon. Seven fires reported since Friday with the largest fire reported around 25 acres in Eastern Washington. Some growth reported on the Abney fire in the Miller Complex. No prescribed burning reported yesterday and no prescribed burns reported as planned. Continued commitment of Northwest resources to California. **NW Team 6, Sheldon, mobilized to the Miller Complex.**

Miller Complex OR-RSF-000647. IMT2, NW Team 6 (Sheldon). 20 miles west of Ashland, OR. Start 8/14. **Monitor/Full Suppression.** Cause: Unknown. 39,410 acres (+158) 86% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Road, trail and area closures. Includes the Abney (32,558 acres). Remaining fires within complex are contained and/or in monitor status.

Chetco Bar OR-RSF-000326. IMT3. 16 miles W of Selma, OR. Start 7/12. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 191,121 acres (+0). 97% containment. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Road, trail, and area closures in place.

Eagle Creek OR-CGF-000493. IMT3. 2 miles S of Cascade Locks, OR. Start 9/2. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Human. 48,831 acres (+0). 50% containment. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Watershed, timberlands, powerline infrastructure, and major transportation corridor threatened. Road, trail, and area closures in place. Command transferred to local unit. **No new information.**

Northwest Fire Potential Summary

Mostly dry conditions today. A wetter and windier weather pattern is expected starting late tonight into Tuesday arriving in Southern Oregon Wednesday. Unsettled weather will continue Wednesday and Thursday with relatively mild temperatures for this time of season. A cold front late in the week will cool the region down to more seasonal temperatures with the return of mountain snow.
