Northwest Activity Summary

Over the last week: Wet and windy for the majority of the time with mountain snow. Only four small fires reported region wide. Many units throughout the region conducted prescribed burns with around 5,500 new acres reported. PNW Team 3 – Livingston/Lewis (short team) has returned from Puerto Rico. Around 20 personnel are assigned outside the region, mainly on hurricane support.
