### Northwest Fire Weather Summary

An upper ridge will be established over the region today and Saturday bringing dry weather. Daytime high temperatures will climb above normal in many areas. On Sunday the next frontal system will approach from the west bringing on a cooling trend and more rain or snow that will increase on Monday. Periods of more precipitation follow through next week.
