Northwest Fire Weather Summary

Dry today with rain returning to the west side Saturday afternoon and a bit over northeastern Oregon and Washington Saturday night and early Sunday. Drying begins on later Sunday and Monday. Occasional showers and wet thundershowers Tuesday and Wednesday with more widespread rain likely later in the week mainly for Oregon and western Washington. Temperature above normal on the west side today and on the east side on Saturday falling below normal on Sunday. Temperature rising back above normal on Monday and Tuesday. General winds increasing from the southwest on Saturday, mainly central Oregon and the Columbia River Gorge.

Northwest Fire Potential Summary

Warmer temperatures today and Saturday will continue to decrease dead fuel moistures. Increasing general winds on Saturday east of the Cascades will pose a potential threat of fires in fine dead fuels or possible risk of burn escapes. Drying of dead fuels will continue next week most areas east of the Cascades.
