Northwest Activity Summary

Light to heavy precipitation continued across the Coastal Ranges and the Olympic Peninsula over the Thanksgiving week. Cloudy to sunny conditions through the week kept temperatures in the 50s for the most part with lows hovering above the freezing mark. Mountain passes and high peaks continued to build up snow accumulations. High humidities and light winds were favorable for pile burning activities to continue.

Northwest Fire Weather Summary

A ridge of high pressure will keep the Pacific Northwest cool and dry today with light general winds. A storm system will bring more precipitation chances to western Washington and northwestern Oregon and higher elevations to the east on Saturday, along with some breezes. A stronger system will bring more significant and widespread precipitation to the region late Sunday and Monday. A series of weather systems should keep precipitation chances in the region through much of the work week.
