### Northwest Activity Summary

West of the Cascades was cool and moist with some isolated coastal drizzle. The remainder of the geographic area remained warm and dry with no precipitation or lightning recorded. Temperatures warmed into the 70s and 80s with areas of southwest Oregon reaching 90 degrees. In eastern Oregon several stations reported humidities in the low teens with isolated single digits and Eastern Washington saw low 20's and 30's. Winds were light area wide. Fire activity increased through the day, but large fire growth remained light.

**Cedar Creek.** OR-WIF-220180. IMT2, NW Team 9. 15 miles E of Oakridge, OR. Start 8/1. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 120,983 acres (+57). 38% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures. Transfer of command to IMT2, NW Team 12 planned for Sunday 10/9.

**Double Creek.** OR-WWF-000400. ICT4. 10 miles SE of Imnaha, OR. Start 8/30. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 171,530 acres (+25). 95% containment. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Road, trail and area closures. Transfer of command to ICT4, 10/6 at 2000. This team is also managing Nebo, Sturgill, and Goat Mountain Two incidents. **Goat Rocks.** WA-GPF-000743. IMT3, NV Team 4. 7 miles E of Packwood, WA. Start 8/9. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 4,552 acres (+126). 0% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures.

**Bolt Creek.** WA-NDC-000150. IMT3. 37 miles E of Seattle, WA. Start 9/10. **Multiple Strategies.** Cause: Human. 12,927 acres (+64). 36% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Road, trail and area closures.

**White River.** WA-OWF-000319. IMT3. 15 miles NW of Plain, WA. Start 8/11. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 5,150 acres (+0). 10% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures.

**Irving Peak.** WA-OWF-000315. IMT3. 16 miles NW of Plain, WA. Start 8/11. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 5,150 (+0). 7% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures.

**Minnow Ridge.** WA-OWF-000479. IMT3. 25 miles N of Wenatchee, WA. Start 9/10. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Unknown. 2,973 acres (+106). 0% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Road, trail and area closures.

**Kalama.** WA-GPF-001028. IMT3. 27 miles NE of Kalama, WA. Start 9/1. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Unknown. 454 acres (+0). 5% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Road, trail and area closures.

Continued dry today and through the weekend. General winds will be light for most of the geographic area.

### Northwest Fire Potential Summary

Fire danger indices remain above normal for most PSAs, particularly in northwestern Oregon and western Washington. However, no widespread strong winds or ignition surges are foreseen so the overall significant fire potential remains low.
