### Northwest Activity Summary

Most of the geographic area was under cloud cover yesterday bringing cooler temperatures. Scattered to moderate precipitation received west of the Cascades. On the east side, scattered precipitation mainly in northeastern Oregon and northeastern Washington. Relative humidity was in the teens again for southeast Oregon. Strong wind gusts recorded in south central and southeast Oregon, breezy conditions elsewhere. Scattered lightning in northeastern Oregon. Large fire growth remained light.

**Cedar Creek.** OR-WIF-220180. Unified Command, IMT2, NW Team 9 (West Zone); IMT2, NW Team 7 (East Zone). 15 miles E of Oakridge, OR. Start 8/1. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 115,428 acres (+429). 25% containment. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures.

**Double Creek.** OR-WWF-000400. IMT1, SA Blue Team. 10 miles SE of Imnaha, OR. Start 8/30. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 161,510 acres (+1,697). 89% containment. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Road, trail and area closures. This team is also managing Nebo, Sturgill, and Goat Mountain Two incidents. **Boulder Mountain.** WA-NES-001858. ICT4. 9 miles NW of Cusick, WA. Start 8/31. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 2,310 acres (+0). 99% containment. Timber. Minimal fire behavior.

**Goat Rocks.** WA-GPF-000743. IMT3, NV Team 4. 7 miles E of Packwood, WA. Start 8/9. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 4,029 acres (+123). 0% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures.

**Bolt Creek.** WA-NDC-000150. IMT3. 37 miles E of Seattle, WA. Start 9/10. **Multiple Strategies.** Cause: Unknown. 12,070 acres (+396). 13% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures.

**Rum Creek.** OR-MED-000243. IMT4. 14 miles NW of Grants Pass, OR. Start 8/17. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 21,347 acres (+0). 95% containment. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Road, trail and area closures.

**White River.** WA-OWF-000319. IMT3. 15 miles NW of Plain, WA. Start 8/11. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 3,895 acres (+0). 10% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures.

**Irving Peak.** WA-OWF-000315. IMT3. 16 miles NW of Plain, WA. Start 8/11. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Lightning. 3,896 acres (+0). 7% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures.

**Minnow Ridge.** WA-OWF-000479. IMT3. 25 miles N of Wenatchee, WA. Start 9/10. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Unknown. 1,787 acres (-1). 0% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Road, trail and area closures.

**Kalama.** WA-GPF-001028. IMT3. 27 miles NE of Kalama, WA. Start 9/1. **Full Suppression.** Cause: Unknown. 435 acres (+0). 5% containment. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Evacuation notices. Road, trail and area closures.

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### Northwest Fire Weather Summary

Expect cool weather and showers tapering off through the day as the upper low shifts east of the region. The eastern edge of the region could see some isolated thunderstorms embedded in the showers. Winds will be lighter than yesterday, but stay breezy through the day, particularly through Cascade gaps. Cooler temperatures and higher relative humidities should limit the impacts of the wind. Temperatures will warm Friday into next week as upper-level pressure builds. Offshore flow is likely but appears to stay light through the weekend, so while it will warm and dry the west side, its main impact will be to hamper ridge top humidity recoveries. Models are still uncertain beyond the weekend, but most favor continued warm and dry conditions through much of next week.

### Northwest Fire Potential Summary

Potential for new significant fires remains low across the region. Breezy winds boost spread potential east of the Cascades again today, but cool and moist conditions limit concerns.
