Northwest Activity Summary

Activity was light east of the Cascades, but some fires were reported in the Oregon and Washington Coast Range as well late in the week as easterly winds with dry air swept from inland out to the coast. A frontal system moved in from the Pacific on Tuesday bringing onshore winds and significant precipitation to the west side and some east side mountains, while the Harney Basin and parts of the Columbia Basin stayed dry.

Northwest Fire Weather Summary

Aside from a few lingering post-frontal showers, a transient upper-level ridge will bring dry conditions back to the region along with light offshore winds today and on Thanksgiving Day. A series of disturbances will move into the region starting Friday with cool temperatures and periodic precipitation lasting through much of next week.
