

I. **INTRODUCTION**

The 2004 Zone fire season was characterized by a very warm and dry spring with normal to below normal summer temperatures and normal precipitation. Accordingly, the CD statistics were very much below the five year average.

The new dispatch facility is still on track for construction in 2005. We hope to move in by the fall. The BLM has entered into a 20 year lease with the City of Cody Airport Board for the land. The land is located on the southeast corner of the Yellowstone Regional Airport grounds.

II. **ADMINISTRATION**

**STAFF:** Personnel from the U.S. Forest Service, Shoshone National Forest, Bureau of Land Management, Worland Field Office and Bureau of Indian Affairs, Rocky Mountain Area Office provide year round coverage at CDC.

CDC did not use an expanded dispatch organization in 2004. The Shoshone National Forest leased a 8' x 36' trailer from July through September for Expanded Dispatch operations. They also provided power and phone service. The BLM equipped the trailer with furniture, laptop computers, printer and a facsimile machine. The trailer was parked at CDC.
