The 2015 fire season turned out to be a slightly below average year for fires and well below average for acres burned. The first fire of the season occurred on January 31st and the last fire on December 9th. Total number of fires for all agencies this season was 179, of those 144 were human caused and 35 lightning. Total acres for all agencies was 6569. The 5 year average for number of fires and acres is 208 fires for 27993 acres for all agencies within the Cody Interagency Dispatch Center area.

The dispatch center supported several extended attack fires, including 3 Type 3 incidents (Burlington Assist, Byron Assist and Sheep Creek), 1 Type 2 incident (Crooked Creek) and a long term fire (Little Bob Lake). The Little Bob Lake fire burned 2000 acres and was managed as a long term resource benefit fire.

The Cody Interagency Dispatch center began mobilizing resources in early March. The dispatch center mobilized equipment, crews, aircraft, overhead and supplies totaling 1732 resource orders processed in support of local incidents as well as incidents in Wyoming, California, Colorado, Montana, New Mexico, Idaho, South Dakota, Alaska, Washington, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Florida, Georgia and North Dakota. Expanded Dispatch was in place for a little over a month, 37 days. The dispatch center was involved in dispatching 90 members of Team Rubicon, an international aid organization made up primarily of former military personnel, to fire assignments in Alaska, California, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon and Washington.

The Dispatch Center was not fully staffed, the BIA position continues to remain vacant.

2 FS firefighters were detailed into the center for the summer, with 1 being reassigned to the center as a permanent seasonal. 569 Incident Actions were processed this past year which included wildfire appropriate management responses, prescribed fire support, public assists, all risk incidents, flight requests/following for: the USFS Regional Forest Health Flight, USGS Stream Gauge Inventory, Wilderness, Radio Repeater Maintenance, and Sage Grouse program flights.

On the Horizon, the dispatch center staff continues to represent and support the dispatch community at the area and national level with personnel involved in training, ROSS Reports Management Board, WildCAD, National Dispatch Training Steering committee, and assisting centers across the board with reports, web pages, and computer programs.








5 - Year Averages: Fires and Acres






Resource Order Requests Processed




Crew Summary
