

CASPER DISPATCH AREA

A COLD FRONT WILL APPROACH THE AREA FROM THE WEST TODAY AND BRING ISOLATED TO SCATTERED SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS IN THE AFTERNOON. A FEW STORMS COULD BECOME STRONG WITH ERRATIC DOWNBURST WINDS. A GUSTY WEST TO SOUTHWESTERLY BREEZE WILL BLOW AT TIMES AS WELL. EXPECT GOOD TO VERY GOOD MIXING CONDITIONS AND SMOKE DISPERSAL. SUNDAY AND MONDAY WILL BE COOLER WITH HIGHER RELATIVE HUMIDITY AND A CONTINUED CHANCE OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS.
