

...RED FLAG WARNING FOR ZONE 280 CONTINUES THROUGH EARLY SATURDAY EVENING...RED FLAG WARNING FOR ZONES 281...285...AND 300 BEGINNING NOON TODAY AND CONTINUING THROUGH SATURDAY EVENING...

FIRE DANGER ELEVATED TO EXTREME FOR MOST OF THE AREA TODAY THROUGH SATURDAY EVENING, AS WARM/HOT/DRY AND VERY GUSTY WIND CONDITIONS CONTINUE ACROSS THE AREA. EXTREME FIRE DANGER WILL EXIST ACROSS ZONES 280, 281, 285 AND 300 TODAY AS CRITICALLY DRY FUELS COMBINE WITH LOW RH VALUES AND VERY GUSTY WINDS. THESE CONDITIONS WILL CONTINUE THROUGH SATURDAY EVENING. RELATIVELY DRY THUNDERSTORMS ACROSS PORTIONS OF NATRONA COUNTY TODAY WILL EXACERBATE THE FIRE DANGER.

.DISCUSSION...

COLD FRONT STILL ON TRACK TO MOVE INTO THE NORTHERN NEBRASKA PANHANDLE AND EAST CENTRAL WYOMING THROUGH THE AFTERNOON HOURS TODAY. AHEAD OF THIS FRONT, WESTERLY WINDS WILL BECOME QUITE STRONG. VERY WARM TEMPERATURES EXPECTED TODAY WITH MID 90S EXPECTED IN SOUTHEAST WYOMING AND NEAR 100 IN THE NEBRASKA PANHANDLE. AFTERNOON HUMIDITIES WILL BECOME QUITE LOW ACROSS THE AREA AHEAD OF THE FRONT. SOME HUMIDITY RECOVERY BEHIND THE FRONT FOR THE PANHANDLE AND EXTREME SOUTHEAST WYOMING, BUT CONVERSE, ALBANY AND CARBON COUNTIES EXPECTED TO SEE POOR OVERNIGHT RECOVERIES. MORE WIDESPREAD WINDS FOR SATURDAY WITH AFTERNOON HUMIDITIES BECOMING CRITICAL FOR MUCH OF THE AREA.

.DISCUSSION...

COLD FRONT STILL ON TRACK TO MOVE INTO THE NORTHERN NEBRASKA PANHANDLE AND EAST CENTRAL WYOMING THROUGH THE AFTERNOON HOURS TODAY. AHEAD OF THIS FRONT, WESTERLY WINDS WILL BECOME QUITE STRONG. VERY WARM TEMPERATURES EXPECTED TODAY WITH MID 90S EXPECTED IN SOUTHEAST WYOMING AND NEAR 100 IN THE NEBRASKA PANHANDLE. AFTERNOON HUMIDITIES WILL BECOME QUITE LOW ACROSS THE AREA AHEAD OF THE FRONT. SOME HUMIDITY RECOVERY BEHIND THE FRONT FOR THE PANHANDLE AND EXTREME SOUTHEAST WYOMING, BUT CONVERSE, ALBANY AND CARBON COUNTIES EXPECTED TO SEE POOR OVERNIGHT RECOVERIES.
