2024 Summary:

Casper Dispatch experienced a higher-than-average fire season having 417 fires for 389,304 acres. This was well above our 10-year average of 298 starts for 96,216 acres. Our first fire occurred February 1st and our last fire occurred November 2nd. The dispatch center supported 6 Type 3 incidents and supported 5 fires that a Complex Incident Management Team (CIMT) was overseeing.

The moisture that we received last year led to an increased fuel loading for this year. The season started out above average with a type 3 fire early in the year. The dispatch zone continued to get hotter and dryer, but we did receive moisture around the end of July that gave us a lull, especially in High Desert District. However, we quickly dried out by the middle of August leading to an above average late season, where we saw record ERCs for much of September and October.


Casper Dispatch mobilized firefighting resources to support out of area incidents starting in January and continued to do that into December. In February, the dispatch zone was regularly sending firefighters to the Southern Area for prescribed burning. By April and May we sent firefighting resources to the Southwest, southern Rocky


Mountain areas. In June and into the rest of summer we started mobilizing resources within the Rocky Mountain area, while still sending suppression and support resources to wildfires throughout the nation.



With the limited amount of precipitation and snowfall we got this past year, our fire units couldn't burn as much as they anticipated.



Aviation Summary:

Helicopter 8BH came on contract June 6th in Rawlins, WY. Their contract ended September 3^{rd,} but they were extended until September 30th. Their first fire was Firehole just SW of Rock Springs, WY on day 3 of their MAP. Their first assignment was the Oak Ridge Fire in Colorado. After that they went to Cody and Montana for a few days before returning to the Casper Dispatch Zone where they spent the majority of the summer. They ended their contract in Rawlins. H-8BH transported 577 passengers, 44,123 gallons of water. Out of the 117 days on contract this year, they spent 16 days outside of the Casper Dispatch Zone.

Helicopter 2FS came on contract June 3rd at Duncan Helibase and their contract ended October 1st but was extended until October 26th. They supported firefighters in the Cody, Great Plains and Casper Dispatch zones. They had a total of 76 missions, three of those were non-fire related two of which was a repeater mission on the Bighorn and Shoshone National Forest, and another was a fence material mission for the Wyoming Game and Fish. H-2FS transported 795 passengers and delivered 159,840 gallons of water.

Casper opened a brand-new Air Tanker Base with the ribbon cutting ceremony on June 14th. It became fully operational on June 17th and it closed October 29th. It was home to T-889 and T-832 and numerous Large Airtankers and Scoopers throughout the summer. The Casper Air Tanker Base flew a total of 80 fires and delivered 829,454 gallons of retardant. They supported fires in Wyoming, Colorado, South Dakota, Nebraska, Oregon, Montana, Nevada, and Idaho.

Rock Springs SEAT Base opened July 13th and we closed it September 30th. T-823 and T-874 were housed there for the remainder of the SEAT Base operation for 2024. They flew on 14 fires and delivered 30,756 gallons of retardant and supported Wyoming, Colorado, and Utah.
