Arrows indicate Team fires


2012 YEAR IN REVIEW

- FTC started the year with mild weather and little snow which resulted in an early and continuous fire season lasting into December with the Fern Lake Fire. The zone broke records for acres burned (145,925 acres) and teams mobilized; we had 8 type 3, 2 type 2 and 4 type 1 and 1 NEMO Team mobilized between April and December. The first team was mobilized for the Hewlett fire in May and last team in December for the Fern Lake fire. With the 2 most notable fires being the High Park fire in June (second largest fire in the State) and the Fern Lake fire which started on October 9th and saw a team mobilization in December and was not contained in 2012. While the zone did get some snow in December we still ended the year below average.


2012 YEAR IN REVIEW

- FTC had a expanded organization in place for 73 days during the 2012 season and 24 hour coverage for 61 days which proved to be a assets in responding to incidents and requests during the timeframes we would not have been staffed.
- In order to support the activity FTC enhanced our militia capabilities by providing 3 additional D-110 classes during the year and with the activity we were able to utilize 54 local zone trainees in dispatch positions for 411 days assigned. To take further advantage of the activity FTC was experiencing we did accept training position in almost all dispatch functions and provided a high quality training assignment, which we will continue to make available to the Region Dispatch organizations.
- During the High Park incident FTC saw a large number of Aircraft in the zone with 31 being assigned at one time during the incident. We also saw more IR flights being requested due to the large incidents with the last one being requested in December in support of the Fern Lake Incident.


INCIDENT TOTALS




INCIDENTS BY DAY




INCIDENTS BY HOUR




INCIDENTS BY AGENCY



INCIDENTS BY COUNTY






FIRES BY AGENCIES




ACRES BY AGENCIES

RMP FIRES AND ACRES BY MONTH







2012 FTC ZONE TOTAL REQUESTS




OVERHEAD ORDERS IN ZONE




OVERHEAD ORDERS OUT OF ZONE




ENGINE ORDERS IN ZONE



ENGINE ORDERS OUT OF ZONE




CREWS BY AGENCY IN ZONE








OTHER AIRCRAFT BY TYPE
