### GREAT PLAINS INTERAGENCY DISPATCH CENTER 2016 YEAR END REPORT

The weather within the Great Plains zone for 2016 was a bit unpredictable as usual. January through May saw temperatures near to below normal, however the snow pack was a bit down in most areas. May and June, normally the zones wetter months produced little precipitation, although the area did have some severe storms which produced tornados in South Central and Western South Dakota. The later part of July and August showed an increase in precipitation, but also brought lightning. Thus beginning a fairly active prairie fire season that continued into November, with falls temperatures well above normal.

The fire season was about as unpredictable as the weather, the Cold fire began on April 2<sup>nd</sup> with active group torching and running fire behavior in the timber. Also in the later part of April the Storm Hill fire surprised fire fighters with how hot it had burned through the evening. After that the majority of the zone saw a normal fire season, however Crook County in northeastern Wyoming saw a pretty active June and July with a number of large type 3 and type 4 incidents. Kara Creek being the largest at 12, 347 acres which started on June 24<sup>th</sup>. Also igniting on June 24<sup>th</sup> was the zones only type 2 incident the Crow Peak, which the Rocky Mountain Black Team was ordered. The team did an excellent job in managing the fire and containing it to 2,734 acres, with no structures lost and no serious medicals.

Due to the lack winter snow pack and below average precipitation in May and June, there was much concern about the increasing drought in Central South Dakota, which lead to the declaration of the Governor Emergency Fire Plan on July 16<sup>th</sup>. This plan assisted local departments which additional resources and funding as needed, the plan was rescinded on September 8<sup>th</sup>.

The Cottonwood Fire in October, thought to be the 5<sup>th</sup> largest fire recorded in South Dakota state history was controlled at 41,360 and reportedly killed approximate 135 head of cattle. The Pine Ridge Agency also reported several type 3 and type 4 incidents throughout the months of September through November.

The active fire season in the southeast and prescribed burning project throughout the zone kept the dispatch center busy, working weekends and extended staffing through mid-November.

Andy Solvie, FS Lead Dispatcher took a 60 day detail as the Assistant Center Manager in Cody dispatch, while Jake Wolff, Alaska Smoke Jumper did a 60 day detail here at Great Plains. Rachel and Michelle each took an assignment to Rocky Mountain Coordination Center and both were signed off on their EDRC task books. Sheri was able to get out on two assignments to Colorado with the Blue Team. Angie and Paul managed the Center, keeping everyone happy and safe.

2016 Bureau of Land Management Information

As part of the annual operating plan between South Dakota Bureau of Land Management (SD-SDD) and the State of South Dakota Division of Wildland Fire (SD-SDS), all fire suppression activities are the responsibility of SD-SDS, therefore suppression information and numbers are lumped into the SD-SDS statistics. However, prescribed fire is not part of the agreement; therefore information given to Great Plains Dispatch for RX within the zone is posted on the GPC Situation Report.

## **2016 Great Plains Air Operations Rapid City Air Tanker Base (KRAP ATB)**

On April 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Rapid City ATB was stood up to receive heavies in response to the Cold Fire and remained stood up until April 12<sup>th</sup>. The regular full service contract was in place June 1<sup>st</sup> through September 30<sup>th</sup>, with no extension. The Air Tanker base had a fairly busy season, hosting LAT's; T-05, T-06, T-07, T-41, T-44, T-45 and T-161. And SEAT's; T-455. T-824, T-828, T-850 and T-866.

### National Type I Exclusive Use Contract H-N184CH

The 2016 Exclusive Use Type 1 contract mandatory availability period (MAP) ran June 13<sup>th</sup> through September 12<sup>th</sup> with extensions on both ends for a total of 5 days. Great Plains the first to bring them on June 11<sup>th</sup> for the McKenna fire and the Beaver Creek fire extending after their MAP. The ship remained in the Rocky Mountain area for the entirety of its tour.


