Reporting Office	PL	Evening Remarks:
CO-CRC	1	No new IA. Sunny in zone.
CO-DRC	1	While today was warmer and drier, significant rainfall over the past week kept fire danger low. More rain and cool temperatures are in the forecast.
CO-FTC	1	Warmer Temps today, In Fort Collins 58 degrees. No IA, Assisting RMP with a SAR
CO-GJC	1	today's weather cool temps mostly sunny, snow received in the past few days remains in place on higher elevations. Anticipated weather for 10/13/18 Mostly sunny with some scattered clouds and cool temps remain in place. No I/A to report.
CO-MTC	1	Single tree lightning fire. Less precipitation than previous 7 days. No needs or concerns.
CO-PBC	1	No IA. Warmer drier day today, Cold system anticipated for Saturday evening bringing snow to Southern Colorado on Sunday. Freezes expected for Monday and Tuesday
CO-RMC	1	A strong cold front will race southward across the Plains Saturday and Sunday. Temps are expected to fall to 20 to 30 degrees below average behind this front across the Rockies and the Plains this weekend. Record low max temperatures are possible Sunday from the Upper Mississippi Valley into Central to Southern Plains and Central Rockies. Heavy snows are possible across the Northern to Central Rockies and into the Northern and Central High Plains...including Cheyenne and Denver.
SD-GPC	1	1 new IA's today, Hay bales on fire Approx. 3 acres on SD-SDS In weather it is suppose to warm up a little in to the 40's & 50's with a chance of rain/snow tomorrow then get cold for Sunday with a chance for snow.
WY-CPC	1	Snow expected over the weekend!
WY-CDC	1	No new IA. Weather was partly cloudy with gusty winds across the zone, cold front is moving into the area and will bring 1-3" of snow across the zone, weather forecast calls for temperatures in the mid 50's all next week.
