CO-CRC	2	Overhead clouds, Moisture throughout the zone, 1 New IA on County lands.
CO-DRC	1	No new fires today. The work week will start off dry and cool with an increasing threat of shower activity by the middle of the week as the next storm system drops into the southern Great Basin region.
CO-FTC	2	No new IA. Low clouds, showers, and drizzle through Monday.
CO-GJC	2	No IA. Partly sunny, cool, breezy. Aviation available on UCR: 1 ASM, 1 Air Attack, 2 T-1 LATs, 3 SEATs, 1 T-3 helo committed to Gutzler Fire CO-WRF but available local.
CO-MTC	2	No new fire activity. Breezy and Partly cloudy with scattered showers.
CO-PBC	1	No new IA, Freeze warning for San Luis Valley. Scattered showers, below average temps for the next few days. Anticipating snow in the mountains.
CO-RMC	2	Minimal IA reported for the RMA on Sunday. Continued Showers and higher elevation snow likely expands into Colorado (especially north) on Monday, with showers and thunderstorms across the eastern plains.
