

Cumberland Gap Wildland Fire Module

The Cumberland Gap Wildland Fire Module was established in 2001. CUGA WFM is a Type 1 Wildland Fire Module and meets all the standards identified in the Interagency Standards for Wildland Fire Modules Operations (PMS 430). CUGA WFM is one of only two Wildland Fire Modules in the southeast region. The Module is part of the National Park Service's Southeast Fire Management Program and is a national resource. Their host park Cumberland Gap National Historical Park, is located in the mountains of Kentucky, Tennessee, and Virginia. The goal of CUGA WFM is to provide a highly skilled professional and technical resource for prescribed fire, hazardous fuels mitigation, wildland fire managed for resource benefit, wildland fire suppression, and all risk assignments.
