## **Incident within an Incident Scenario**

**Incident Name: Spring Valley Rx**

**Date: October 21**

**Time: 1230**

You are the Prescribed Burn Boss for the Spring Valley Rx. With good moisture during the monsoons, resource availability and winds out of the NW burning conditions are favorable. Low Temps, winds out of the North, good ventilation for next 3 days and moisture coming in a week it is important to get unit burned today. Resources on scene are from KNF, GCNP, COF and local volunteer fire departments. Some of the resources have never worked together before but you are not worried about it.

Ground ignitions include hand lighting with drip torches for uneven terrain and ATV with torches attached to the back for the flat areas with high grass. The firing boss calls to notify you that ignitions are complete when you overhear someone on the ignition crew is missing.
