Medical, "Extreme" Employee/Public Safety Issues

PRIORITY

Public Safety – extreme unsafe shooting, off road traveling Resource Crimes – theft/collecting, damaging, dumping UDAs – traveling in vehicles, groups on foot

OTHER

Reporting – trash piles, cut fences/damaged signs, abandoned vehicles Information – new "UDA Layup Areas," areas cleaned, new information Events – scheduling, patrols, repairs, cleanups, meetings, etc.

BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT

- BE CAUTIOUS OF FOLLOWING: High speed driving/law enforcement pursuits
- Language barriers increase risks
- Risk of contact with unknown personnel
- Radio and cell phone 'dead spots'

- Use only trained responses

- Know where you are/describe your location
- Let supervisor or dispatch know your trip plan
