 27 **GREAT BASIN AGREEMENTS.** Successful management within the Great Basin requires close  
 28 cooperation among a number of departments, agencies, and organizations, both within and outside  
 29 the wildland firefighting community. Dispatchers and personnel must be knowledgeable regarding the  
 30 abilities and needs of cooperators. Great Basin cooperative agreements are listed in this Chapter. It  
 31 is generally most effective to handle cooperative efforts at a local level. However, if needed  
 32 assistance is not available at the local level, direct the request to the Great Basin Coordination  
 33 Centers.

34  
 35 The Great Basin has border agreements in place which allow for resource sharing/ordering between  
 36 local dispatch offices across geographic area boundaries. Local dispatch centers adjacent to one  
 37 another that have established agreements may engage in resource ordering across geographic area  
 38 boundaries. The sending GACC must grant approval to the local centers before any National  
 39 resources are mobilized across geographic boundaries. Resources mobilized across geographic  
 40 area boundaries cannot be reassigned without prior approve from send GACC/local unit.

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 42 • **AGREEMENTS BETWEEN GREAT BASIN FIREFIGHTING AGENCIES/UNITS AND**  
 43 **FIREFIGHTING AGENCIES/UNITS OUTSIDE THE GREAT BASIN.** The following agreements  
 44 pertain to those implemented between a Great Basin Firefighting Unit/Agency (or Units/Agencies)  
 45 and one or more Firefighting Unit/Agency outside the Great Basin.

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 47 ○ **USDA-FS REGION 1, REGION 4, AND REGION 6 AGREEMENT (TRI-REGION).** For rapid  
 48 Initial Attack in the Snake-Salmon Fire Management Complex, it is advantageous to the three  
 49 involved Regions to share resources. For smokejumpers, smokejumper aircraft, airtankers,  
 50 lead planes, helicopters, helitack crews, and ground forces, orders will be placed, received,  
 51 and action initiated by the Forest Dispatchers. The Great Basin Coordination Centers should  
 52 be notified immediately if these resources are committed to any incident.

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 54 ○ **REGION 5 AGREEMENT.** This agreement is an annual operating plan between the  
 55 following agencies: Bureau of Land Management (Carson City and Susanville Districts);  
 56 Nevada Division of Forestry (Western Region); USDA- Forest Service, Region 5, Lake Tahoe  
 57 Basin Management Unit and the Tahoe, Plumas, and Eldorado National Forests; USDA-

1 Forest Service, Region 4, Toiyabe National Forest; and the Truckee Meadows (NV) Fire  
2 Protection District.

3  
4 The agreement permits Initial Attack or first burning period forces, airtankers, helitack, and  
5 ground forces to be ordered direct regardless of Regional or State boundaries. Sending and  
6 receiving units shall notify the Western Great Basin Coordination Center that forces have  
7 been committed.

- 8  
9 ○ **USDA-FS REGION 1 AND REGION 4 BOUNDARY AGREEMENT.** The Salmon, Challis,  
10 Targhee, Payette, and Boise National Forests in Region 4, and the Bitterroot, Beaverhead,  
11 and Nez Perce National Forests in Region 1 can request direct assistance from adjacent  
12 Forests as necessary to provide for exchange of Initial Attack forces, information and  
13 cooperation in suppression along common boundaries.

- 14  
15 ○ **USDA-FOREST SERVICE REGION 4, REGION 5, AND REGION 6, USDI-BUREAU OF**  
16 **LAND MANAGEMENT, NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, AND THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.**  
17 This Cooperative Fire Agreement provides a level of wildland fire protection for the  
18 intermingled lands equivalent to similar lands protected directly by state or federal agencies.  
19 This protection is assumed by administrative units of either the federal agencies or the state.  
20 (January 13, 1997).

- 21  
22 ○ **THE CALIFORNIA COOPERATIVE WILDLAND FIRE MANAGEMENT AND STAFFORD**  
23 **ACT RESPONSE AGREEMENT (CFMA) 2008 BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES**  
24 **DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR, BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, CALIFORNIA AND**  
25 **NEVADA; UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR, NATIONAL PARK SERVICE,**  
26 **PACIFIC-WEST FIELD AREA; UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE,**  
27 **FOREST SERVICE, REGION FOUR, FIVE AND SIX; AND STATE OF CALIFORNIA,**  
28 **DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY AND FIRE PROTECTION.** Section IV subsection 16c  
29 provides that the “State and Federal Agencies shall jointly develop local and/or Sub-  
30 Geographic Operating Plans”.

31  
32 This agreement allows Sub Geographic Cooperative operating plans between USFS ENF,  
33 HTF, TMU, TNF, BLM-CCD, NDF and Cal Fire AEU & NEU. This agreement allows for  
34 sharing of resources that can be ordered direct across Regional, State and GACC  
35 boundaries for Initial Attack Incidents. The agreement also allows for CALFIRE to respond  
36 Initial Attack into Nevada as far East as the Hwy 395 corridor.

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38 ○ **USDA-FS, NEZ PERCE NATIONAL FOREST AND SALMON NATIONAL FOREST.** This  
39 Interregional agreement and Memorandum of Understanding between the Nez Perce and  
40 Salmon National Forests authorizes the transfer of administrative responsibilities and  
41 authority from the Nez Perce National Forest to the Salmon National Forest concerning  
42 management practices of the Region 1 lands located in the Frank Church River-of-No-Return  
43 Wilderness (1991).

- 44  
45 ○ **USDA-FS, NEZ PERCE NATIONAL FOREST, PAYETTE NATIONAL FOREST, AND THE**  
46 **WALLOWA-WHITMAN NATIONAL FOREST.** This agreement provides for the most efficient  
47 and effective management of escaped wildfires requiring significant logistical support on the  
48 Idaho portion of the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area - No. 11-910-CT4-1 (April 24,  
49 1987).

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51 ○ **WYOMING, STATE FORESTRY DIVISION; USDA FOREST SERVICE REGIONS 2 AND 4;**  
52 **USDI BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, WYOMING; NATIONAL PARK SERVICE,**  
53 **INTERMOUNTAIN FIELD AREA OFFICE; BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS, BILLINGS**  
54 **AREA OFFICE; AND THE FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE, MOUNTAIN PRAIRIE REGION.**  
55 This Cooperative Fire Protection Agreement and related operating plans document  
56 agreement and commitments to fire protection assistance and cooperation between all  
57 signing agencies. (April 9, 1996)

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- **USDI BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, IDAHO STATE OFFICE, AND USDA-FS, REGION 1.** This is an interagency airtanker operating plan that allows Idaho Falls to order an airtanker direct from West Yellowstone for Initial Attack. Upper Columbia / Salmon / Clearwater District BLM may order direct from Missoula for Initial Attack within the Missoula airtanker area of influence.
  - **USDA-FS, DIXIE NATIONAL FOREST; USDI-NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, ZION NATIONAL PARK, CEDAR BREAKS NATIONAL MONUMENT, PIPE SPRING NATIONAL MONUMENT; AND BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, CEDAR CITY DISTRICT AND ARIZONA STRIP DISTRICT.** This Southwest Utah Initial Emergency Response Interagency Agreement provides a vehicle enabling coordinated emergency response and facilitates the cooperative use of resources during fire or other emergencies in the southwest Utah and northwest Arizona area across the geographic boundaries of the Great Basin and the Southwest Regions.
  - **USDA-FS, DIXIE NATIONAL FOREST; USDI-NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, ZION NATIONAL PARK; AND BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, CEDAR CITY DISTRICT AND ARIZONA STRIP DISTRICT.** This Interagency Helicopter Agreement sets forth the responsibilities for the management, funding, and utilization of a helicopter crew and contract, hereafter referred to as the Color Country Interagency Helitack program within the jurisdiction of the Dixie National Forest; Arizona Strip District; Cedar City District; and Zion National Park. It was also implemented to increase the level and efficiency of wildland protection and other emergencies.
  - **USDI-BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, ARIZONA STRIP AND CEDAR CITY FIELD OFFICES; BRYCE CANYON AND ZION NATIONAL PARKS; GLEN CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA; SOUTHERN PAIUTE BIA FIELD STATION; USDA-FS, DIXIE NATIONAL FOREST REGION 4 AND KAIBAB NATIONAL FOREST REGION 3.** For rapid Initial Attack in the north Kaibab NF area, it is advantageous to the two involved Regions to share resources. For smokejumpers, smokejumper aircraft, airtankers, lead planes, helicopters, helitack crews, and ground forces, orders will be placed, received, and action initiated by the Forest Dispatchers. The Great Basin Coordination Centers should be notified immediately if these resources are committed to any incident.
  - **USDI-BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT IN COLORADO, UTAH, WYOMING, AND IDAHO.** This Memorandum of Understanding provides mutual assistance of personnel, equipment, supplies, and aircraft for Initial Attack, extended attack pre-positioning, technical assistance, training, prevention, detection, trespass, and investigation for fire suppression between adjacent districts across state boundaries
  - **THE GREATER YELLOWSTONE AREA: USDA-FS, BEAVERHEAD NATIONAL FOREST, BRIDGER-TETON NATIONAL FOREST, CUSTER NATIONAL FOREST, GALLATIN NATIONAL FOREST, SHOSHONE NATIONAL FOREST, TARGHEE NATIONAL FOREST AND NPS, GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK, YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK.** This Interagency Fire Management is to establish specific operating procedures for the coordination and management of various fire activities including: Wildland Fire Use, Wildfires, Management Ignited Prescribed Fires on common boundaries, Fire Training and Prevention. Units may directly exchange resources utilizing the closest forces concept (April 26, 1995).
  - **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN GREAT BASIN COORDINATING GROUP AND ROCKY MOUNTAIN COORDINATING GROUP.** The Great Basin and Rocky Mountain Coordinating Groups agreed to join in the management and utilization of the Type I Incident Management Teams and Buying Teams for the two geographic areas (February 7, 1995).

- 1 ○ **IDAHO COOPERATIVE FIRE PROTECTION AGREEMENT: USDI- BUREAU OF LAND**  
2 **MANAGEMENT IDAHO, NATIONAL PARK SERVICE PACIFIC NORTHWEST REGION,**  
3 **BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS PORTLAND AREA, FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE**  
4 **PACIFIC REGION; USDA - FS REGION 1, 4 & 6; AND THE STATE OF IDAHO**  
5 **DEPARTMENT OF LANDS.** This Cooperative Agreement’s purpose is to cooperate in fire  
6 prevention, preparedness, suppression, and all-hazard of mutual advantage to all  
7 participating agencies (April 17, 1996).  
8
- 9 ○ **INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COLORADO STATE OFFICE BUREAU OF**  
10 **LAND MANAGEMENT, DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND THE USDA-FS REGIONS**  
11 **2 & 4.** This agreement provides a basis to implement the “closest forces” concept for the  
12 movement of resources across State and Region jurisdictional boundaries of the adjacent  
13 Forests of Eastern Utah and the Forests, and/or BLM Districts of Western Colorado in all  
14 aspects of wildland fire management, through the Grand Junction Air Center, located in  
15 Grand Junction, Colorado. (1987)  
16
- 17 ○ **FIRE SUPPRESSION MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING, COLORADO-UTAH-**  
18 **WYOMING-IDAHO, BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT.** This MOU is between the State  
19 Directors of Colorado, Utah, Wyoming, and Idaho to promote natural resource enhancement  
20 and protection through the proper suppression and application of fire on public lands  
21 administered by Colorado, Utah, Wyoming, and Idaho.  
22
- 23 ○ **INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT BETWEEN USDA FOREST SERVICE - PAYETTE**  
24 **NATIONAL FOREST AND USDI BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT - VALE DISTRICT.**  
25 The purpose of this agreement is to provide cooperation involving Initial Attack fire  
26 suppression resources between the Forest Service and the BLM. It is mutually advantageous  
27 to both the BLM and the Forest Service to coordinate their efforts in the detection and  
28 suppression of wildfires in a highly inaccessible area adjacent to Hell’s Canyon, utilizing  
29 closest forces.  
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- 31 ● **AGREEMENTS AMONG GREAT BASIN FIREFIGHTING AGENCIES / UNITS.** The following  
32 agreements pertain to those implemented among Great Basin Firefighting Unit/Agency (or  
33 Units/Agencies).  
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- 35 ○ **BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS-PHOENIX AREA OFFICE AND USDI-BUREAU OF LAND**  
36 **MANAGEMENT, STATE OFFICES OF NEVADA AND UTAH.** This interagency agreement  
37 provides for mutual assistance and support of Bureau of Indian Affairs and Bureau of Land  
38 Management fire control and related activities (March 11, 1985).  
39
- 40 ○ **BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS AND USDA-FS, REGION 4.** This cooperative agreement  
41 authorizes mutual control action on Bureau of Indian Affairs land and National Forest -  
42 Region 4 lands within the states of Utah and Nevada - (No. 22-14 (1967).  
43
- 44 ○ **COOPERATIVE FIRE MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN USDI BUREAU OF**  
45 **LAND MANAGEMENT-UTAH, NATIONAL PARK SERVICE INTERMOUNTAIN REGION,**  
46 **BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS WESTERN REGIONAL OFFICE, BUREAU OF INDIAN**  
47 **AFFAIRS SOUTHWESTERN REGIONAL OFFICE, BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS**  
48 **NAVAJO REGIONAL OFFICE, U.S. FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE MOUNTIAN AND**  
49 **PRAIRIE REGION, USDA-FS INTERMOUNTIAN REGION, AND THE STATE OF UTAH**  
50 **DIVISION OF FORESTRY, FIRE & STATE LANDS.** This cooperative agreement’s purpose  
51 is to cooperate in fire prevention, pre-suppression, and suppression of mutual advantage to  
52 all participating agencies. (2001)  
53
- 54 ○ **USDA-FS, DIXIE NATIONAL FOREST & USDI-BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, LAS**  
55 **VEGAS DISTRICT.** This Interagency agreement sets forth the responsibilities for the  
56 cooperative management of a mutual Initial Attack fire management system on adjacent  
57 lands, within the jurisdictions of the Dixie National Forest and the BLM Las Vegas District.

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- **COOPERATIVE FIRE PROTECTION AGREEMENT BETWEEN USDI, BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, NEVADA; USDA-FS, REGIONS 4 & 5; & STATE OF NEVADA, DIVISION OF FORESTRY.** This Cooperative Agreement's purpose is to cooperate in fire prevention, preparedness, and suppression of mutual advantage to all participating agencies (2005).
  - **USDI-BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT AND USDA-FOREST SERVICE.** The USDA-Forest Service maintains a fire protection organization for National Forest System lands and Bureau of Land Management lands within designated National Forest protection districts. This Agreement states method of payment to USFS from BLM. This agreement was updated in July 1991, to designate which offices have coordination responsibilities for designated geographic areas and resources - No. 22-6 (June 27, 1963).
  - **USDA-FS, BOISE NATIONAL FOREST AND PAYETTE NATIONAL FOREST; USDI-BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, BOISE DISTRICT; IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF LANDS, SOUTHWESTERN AREA; AND SOUTHERN IDAHO TIMBER PROTECTION ASSOCIATION (TPS).** This Mutual Agreement is between the Forest Supervisors of the Boise and Payette National Forests, the District Manager of the Boise District BLM, the Area Supervisor of Southwestern Supervisory Area of the Idaho Department of Lands, and the Chief Fire Warden of TPS. All fires detected on cooperating agency lands will be reported through proper channels to the agency with Initial Attack responsibility and to the agency having jurisdictional responsibility (May 1, 1991).
  - **EASTERN IDAHO INTERAGENCY FIRE COOPERATORS: USDA-FS, BRIDGER-TETON NATIONAL FOREST, CARIBOU NATIONAL FOREST, CHALLIS NATIONAL FOREST, SALMON NATIONAL FOREST, SAWTOOTH NATIONAL FOREST; USDI-BLM, (UPPER SNAKE RIVER-EASTERN DISTRICT, UPPER SNAKE RIVER, SOUTH-CENTRAL DISTRICT); BIA, FT. HALL AGENCY; FWS, SOUTHEAST COMPLEX; NPS, GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK, YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK, CRATERS OF THE MOON NATIONAL MONUMENT, AND THE STATE OF IDAHO, DEPARTMENT OF LANDS, THE STATE OF UTAH, DIVISION OF SOVEREIGN LANDS AND FORESTRY.** This interagency fire agreement establishes operating procedures for the coordination and management of various fire activities including: Wildfires, Management Ignited Prescribed Fires, Preparedness, Fire Training and Prevention. Units may directly exchange resources utilizing the closest forces concept (1995),
  - **MOAB INTERAGENCY FIRE COOPERATORS: USDA-MANTI-LASAL NATIONAL FOREST, BLM-MOAB DISTRICT, NPS-CANYON LANDS AND ARCHES NATIONAL PARKS, AND NATURAL BRIDGES NATIONAL MONUMENT.** This interagency fire agreement establishes operating procedures for the movement of resources across State and Regional jurisdictional boundaries of the adjacent protected lands of Eastern Utah and Western Colorado in all aspects of wildland fire management utilizing the "closest forces" concept. Agencies agree to cooperate in the full spectrum of wildland fire management activities and to facilitate the request and movement of fire resources and supplies during an emergency.
  - **USDA FOREST SERVICE - BOISE NATIONAL FOREST, USDI BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT - VALE DISTRICT AND BOISE DISTRICT.** The purpose of this Interagency Agreement is to establish a cooperative fire protection arrangement between the BLM and the Forest Service to facilitate the timely and efficient use of the closest fire suppression resources.

1 • **AGREEMENTS BETWEEN GREAT BASIN FIREFIGHTING AGENCIES AND OTHER**  
 2 **FEDERAL (NON-FIREFIGHTING) AGENCIES.**

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- 4 ○ **USDA-FOREST SERVICE AND USDI-BUREAU OF RECLAMATION.** This agreement  
 5 provides for cooperative fire protection of reclamation withdrawn and acquired land located  
 6 outside National Forest boundaries but within established fire protection districts - No. 22-21  
 7 (June 1970).
- 8
- 9 ○ **FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION (FAA) AND USDA-FS REGION 4 AGREEMENT.**  
 10 This agreement outlines procedures and responsibilities for temporary airport traffic control  
 11 tower services for USDA-FS firefighting activities. This agreement is supplemental to the  
 12 Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the National Interagency Coordination Center  
 13 (NICC) Agreement of August 18, 1969. The Great Basin Coordination Centers will keep a  
 14 copy of the agreement.
- 15
- 16 ○ **NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE.** For the Great Basin Area, see the United States  
 17 Department of Commerce, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration within your  
 18 geographic area.

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20 • **WESTERN GREAT BASIN COORDINATION CENTER AND EASTERN GREAT BASIN**  
 21 **COORDINATION CENTER.** The Western Great Basin Coordination Center (WGBCC)  
 22 coordinates the utilization of all resources within the State of Nevada, as well as those resources  
 23 located in the part of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest located in California, Lake Mead  
 24 National Recreation Area located in Arizona, and the BLM Great Basin Smokejumpers located in  
 25 Boise, Idaho. The Eastern Great Basin Coordination Center (EGBCC) coordinates the utilization  
 26 of all resources within the State of Utah, as well as those resources located in the States of  
 27 Wyoming and Idaho administered by USDA-FS, Region 4.

28

29 Coordination calls between WGBCC and EGBCC shall be placed at least once daily and/or  
 30 whenever the fire situation changes. WGBCC and EGBCC can order, receive, and fill resources  
 31 for any incident in the Great Basin without going through the National Interagency Coordination  
 32 Center (NICC). See Chapters 10 and 20 for specific procedures.

34 • **PRESCOTT CACHE AGREEMENT.**

39 Ordering of Cache Supplies from Great Basin units to Prescott Cache

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41 Procedures and requirements for providing emergency support from the National Interagency  
 42 Support Cache (NISC) at Prescott, Arizona to the Las Vegas District BLM, Ely District BLM,  
 43 Cedar City District BLM, Richfield District BLM, Fishlake National Forest, Spring Mountains  
 44 National Recreation Area, Dixie National Forest, Great Basin National Park, Zion National Park,  
 45 Bryce Canyon National Park, Capital Reef National Park, Glen Canyon National Recreation Area,  
 46 Southern Paiute Field Station, Lake Mead National Recreation Area, Nevada Division of Forestry  
 47 (Southern Region) and Utah Division of State Lands and Forestry (Central and Southwest Areas).

48

49 Dispatch Centers with authority to order supplies directly from the Prescott Cache include: Las  
 50 Vegas Interagency Communications Center, Ely Interagency Communications Center, Cedar City  
 51 Interagency Fire Center and Richfield Interagency Fire Center.

53 I. Purpose

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55 The purpose of this agreement is to enhance National Interagency Incident Management  
 56 System and Incident Command System operations. Operations are enhanced through  
 57 program cost savings realized by better use of NFES resources, simplified ordering

1 procedures, continued use of the closest forces concept, timely return of incident resources,  
2 and definitive procedures for problem identification and resolution.  
3

4 II. Objective  
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6 This agreement will provide the basis and guidance for operations and procedures within the  
7 agencies and their subdivisions. This agreement will address Supply orders (Initial Attack,  
8 Extended Attack and Emergency Restock) only. All other orders will be made in accordance  
9 with the current National Mobilization Plan.  
10

11 III. Procedures  
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13 A. Ordering Authorities  
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- 15 1. The dispatch offices representing the agencies named above may place orders  
16 directly with the National Interagency Support Cache at Prescott, Arizona. If the  
17 Prescott Cache is unable to fill the orders, the local dispatch office will place the order  
18 with the Great Basin Cache in Boise. If the Great Basin Cache cannot fill the order,  
19 then the local dispatch office will place the order with the appropriate coordination  
20 center, who will place the order with the National Interagency Coordination Center  
21 (NICC). In such cases, NICC will be informed that the Prescott Cache has already  
22 been contacted and is unable to fill the order.  
23
- 24 2. Great Basin Coordination Centers retain the option to allow dispatch centers to place  
25 orders direct to the Prescott Cache or require them to place orders through  
26 appropriate Great Basin Coordination Center in an overload situation.  
27

28 B. Resource orders and returns  
29

- 30 1. Orders to the National Interagency Support Cache at Prescott, Arizona, can be  
31 originated only by approved dispatch centers.  
32
- 33 2. Resource orders must contain:  
34
  - 35 a. A USFS management code (P code).
  - 36 b. Realistic date and time required.
  - 37 c. Consolidated requests. Order by standard packs/units of issue as identified in  
38 NFES catalog.
  - 39 d. Transportation/delivery instructions.
  - 40 e. Additional special instructions or requirements.
  - 41 f. Orders should be limited to NFES items identified in the NFES Catalog as  
42 available from the Prescott Cache. The Cache will provide availability  
43 information as requested by ordering units.
- 44 3. Returns should be sent to the National Interagency Support Cache that is closest to  
45 the incident. All returns should be clearly marked so that the incident they are being  
46 returned from is identified.  
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- 48 4. All orders should be sent via facsimile to the National Interagency Support Cache at  
49 Prescott, Arizona.

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2 5. If the Cache office is not open, emergency calls should be referred to the after-hours  
3 phone list or the appropriate coordination center. Prescott Cache Manager  
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5 C. NFES Mobile Support Cache Vans  
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- 7 1. All cache vans belonging to Prescott Cache that are prepositioned into the Great  
8 Basin will be ordered through the appropriate coordination center.  
9  
10 2. Any time a cache van is committed to an incident, a resource order must be used to  
11 notify the appropriate coordination center and the Prescott Cache of the status and  
12 new location. Committed cache vans will be tracked via this order until they are  
13 refurbished and returned to their prepositioning location. A replacement cache van  
14 may be moved into position to replace the committed van, based on discussions with  
15 the Cache Manager, appropriate coordination center and local dispatch center.  
16  
17 3. The National Interagency Support Cache at Prescott, Arizona will have a  
18 predetermined number of cache vans available by May 1.  
19  
20 4. Local units must be aware of their responsibilities in the use of these vans and how to  
21 return them. Regardless of origin (Great Basin Cache, Prescott Cache, etc.), cache  
22 vans should be returned to the closest National Cache location for refurbishment  
23 after being used. Unused vans should be returned to their original pre-positioning  
24 locations unless other arrangements have been approved by the cache manager and  
25 coordinated with the appropriate coordination center.  
26

27 D. National Interagency Support Cache responsibilities  
28

- 29 1. The Cache will provide confirmation of resource order receipt and transmit shipping  
30 information directly to the ordering office.  
31  
32 2. The Cache section will resolve problems directly with the ordering office. Any  
33 changes in the resource order (e.g., exact quantity ordered cannot be shipped) must  
34 be relayed back to the ordering office promptly.  
35

36 E. General Considerations.  
37

- 38 1. Multiple orders must be prioritized by the ordering office. Geographic Area priorities  
39 will be established by the EGBCC and WGBCC, or by the Great Basin MAC Group  
40 (when activated). Priorities will be communicated to the Prescott Cache Manager on  
41 an as-needed basis. Area priority conflicts will be resolved by the Center  
42 Coordinators. Priorities may be mitigated by National priorities established by NICC.  
43 Great Basin Coordination Centers will provide copies of their Situation Reports to the  
44 Prescott Cache.  
45  
46 2. The Prescott Cache Manager will notify the Great Basin Coordination Centers when  
47 there may be competition for NFES resources between the geographic areas, or  
48 when the Cache is nearing drawdown levels due to activity in the Southwest Area.  
49  
50 3. Problems should be identified and resolved as they occur, at the operational level.  
51 Problems not resolved will be referred to the appropriate coordination center and  
52 Cache Manager at the NISC.  
53  
54 4. This Agreement will be in effect until revoked by either of the Coordinating Groups  
55 signing the Agreement. Substantial changes to this Agreement will require the  
56 drafting of a new Agreement, with new signatures from both Coordinating Groups.  
57

1 **INTERAGENCY FACILITIES.** Each of these Interagency Facilities has agreements specifying

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1 **REGULAR MILITARY AGREEMENTS.** The United States Department of Agriculture, the United  
2 States Department of Interior, and the Department of Defense have agreements for all military  
3 assistance. The Great Basin shall request assistance from the military through NICC only after the  
4 Coordinator's clearance.

5  
6 Requests from Dispatchers to a Great Basin Coordination Center for military assistance, including  
7 fuel (Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Navy, Marines, or National Guard), will be documented on a  
8 resource order. Requests will not be made until all civilian resources of the type needed have been  
9 committed. See the Military Use Handbook, NFES #2175, for detailed information concerning use of  
10 the military on wildfires.

11  
12 **STATE GUARD AGREEMENTS.** Requests from Dispatchers to the Great Basin Coordination  
13 Center for military assistance, including fuel (Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Navy, Marines, or  
14 National Guard), will be documented on a resource order. Requests will not be made until all civilian  
15 resources of the type needed have been committed. See the Military Use Handbook for detailed  
16 information concerning use of the military on wildfires.

- 17  
18 • **UTAH NATIONAL GUARD AND THE UTAH STATE FORESTER.** A Wildland Fire Control  
19 Agreement exists between the Utah National Guard and the Utah State Forester who may be  
20 called upon to assist Federal agencies within the state with wildland fires originating on Federal  
21 lands. The state of Utah may need to show reasonable commitment of state firefighting  
22 resources, including National Guard resources, in order to obtain further Federal assistance in  
23 wildland fire control.
- 24  
25 • **IDAHO NATIONAL GUARD.** The Idaho National Guard will honor requests made only through  
26 the IDL State Fire Coordinator. Idaho Units will request assistance from the Eastern Great Basin  
27 Coordination Center who will then contact the IDL State Fire Coordinator.
- 28  
29 • **NEVADA NATIONAL GUARD.** The Nevada National Guard will honor requests via the Western  
30 Great Basin Coordination Center and through the Nevada Division of Forestry.

32 • **WYOMING NATIONAL GUARD.** Units within Wyoming will order through the Cody Interagency  
33 Dispatch Center. Notification will be made to Eastern Great Basin Coordination Center.

35 • **CALIFORNIA NATIONAL GUARD.** National Guard resources of the State of California are  
36 allocated by requests to the California Division of Forestry in Sacramento, California. Orders are  
37 subject to the approval of the Governor of California. All orders should be placed via established  
38 dispatch channels
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
